
<p><b>FCFC (8:30am)</b></p>	<p><b>Cathy Glassford and Megan Kimberlin - FCFC.</b> Cathy asked about the budget timeline for 2019. The timeline was sent out on Monday. She hadn't picked up her mail yet so she will get that from the mail. She then asked about the time and attendance system. The Commissioners and the Administrator passed along what they knew so far. They did explain that questions should go to the Auditors Office. She talked about a couple of her grant programs and where they're at year to date. Cathy than turned the meeting over to Megan to go over the wraparound end of FCFC. Wraparound is going really well. They have some new individuals that have joined the wraparound team. She talked about some of the success stories that have come from the program. The program has been very successful. Wraparound is a little different from case management. Wraparound gets more support to build relationships with the families. The cost of wraparound is much less than having to place a child and then go in and help the family to get back on track. <p><b>Toledo Port Authority (9:30am)</b></p>	<p><b>Teresa Snyder - Port Authority.</b> Teresa Snyder joined us by phone to review the Port Authority Energy District program that goes hand and hand with the Better Building Program. She did forward power point information for everyone to follow along. See attachment B. This is an alternative source of funding that moves the risk to the Port Authority. You are required to have an energy audit completed. The audit will tell you where the greatest energy updates could be of value. They do have a list of auditors that know the program that you can use or you can choose your own. There are several grants available through energy providers that can offset the cost of the audits. The cost of the audits can also be rolled in to the loan. There guideline is basically to save 15% over 15 years. This program can help the whole community. They establish an Energy District that will then include organizations with in the District as they are in the District of the sponsoring project. A five person board is set up they review projects to approve. After review of the program there was questions from the group. 

As the Sandusky County Wraparound Coordinator, it is my mission to help every child and family feel connected to the community, feel supported through challenging times in life, and receive access to services as needed. As a community, we should strive to start every youth off on the right foot for a successful life.

Wraparound is a mix between High Fidelity and Service Coordination. High Fidelity wraparound serves families with more complex needs in a team base setting. Basic service coordination is a less intense process which connects families with different agencies and service supports.

Make a referral if you notice a family or youth struggling with **school work, behavioral issues, social well-being, criminal justice involvement, children service involvement, coping skills, finances, housing, parenting, communication difficulties, or any other barrier a family might have that interferes with school or the social well-being of youth.** Through teamwork and community effort we can all contribute to making a family and youths life better.

In this packet, I have included information about the Wraparound program. A quick reference guide, and a referral sheet. I hope that you will find this information helpful. Please feel free to contact me with any questions or concerns that you may have.
