Health Department (10:30am)	Bethany Brown - Health Department. Commissioners first and foremost wanted to congratulate Bethany on achieving their accreditation. This is a great achievement and they should be very proud. They also have a nurse at the Health Department that was recognized as Nurse of the Year in the State of Ohio. Bethany also asked about their most current record retention schedule. They are working on updating that schedule.
