	Commissioner Reiter and Commissioner Zimmerman and three others were judges at Terra Community Colleges Code-a-thon. There were students from 6th to 11th grade on teams of five and six. The projects focused on mental ability, animals in habitats and solar energy/window panels. They created web sites and all the coding used to structure these sites. They came in on Friday and stayed for two nights working on the sites. They judge the projects on several parts of their presentation. All the students who participated received a \$500.00 scholarship to Terra Community College each. It was very impressive. It was also good to see the

sites and used many technologies on how to inset codes

community level. There were multiple other caucuses

The commissioners also learned people can actually

mechanisms in them so people can pass drug tests.		
Lucas County Commissioners shared that they are		
going to start using an Optical Reader for drug testing to		
avoid some of the testing scams.		
The caucus session also discussed Public Defender		
rates and what the other counties were currently doing.		
Some are raising their rates with the new reimbursement		
funding from the State and some are using it to catch up	14	
from the past. Many counties have not raised their rates		
for years.		
Dorothy Pelanda, Director of Ohio Department of		
Agriculture was the key note speaker for the day. There		
was a large number of people in attendance.		
TMACOG's 2020 Officers were also elected. Mark Stahl,		
Ottawa County Commissioner, was elected and sworn in		
as the Board Chair and Commissioner Reiter was


