Wightman's Grove	Commissioner Zimmerman called meeting to regroup and discuss the progress and upcoming work. Specifically, the roads are scheduled to be paved next week and a suggestion was made that the drainage pipes should be installed by that date to avoid having to dig and repave the road again. The contractor stated that he can have the pipes installed before paving, however, they have been unable to secure all of the materials. Engineer Baez checked his supplies and confirmed that he has the pipe in stock. The contractor will retrieve the pipe from the Engineer's department. The Engineer will send a bill for the cost of the pipe to the Commissioner's office. Pump-stations will be installed after road is complete.
