There are 77 homes that have sewer drainage issues. Right now the discharge is going in to Muddy Creek Bend. The park conducts programs in the Creek and having this drain to the Creek is not a healthy condition. Commissioners asked if she could get a preliminary quote on what the cost would be for this project.
