Attorney General's Office 9:00AM	<p><u>Kim Priestap – Ohio Attorney General's Office.</u> Kim came in to update the Commissioners on programs happening in the AG's office. There are grants available to schools right now that would help link them to local law enforcement. They have funds available for projects that would help pay for technology that would make the schools a safer place and keep them in direct communication with law enforcement. Deadline is March 21st for them to apply. She has been in touch with the local schools to make sure they have all the information they need. There are new CPT training hours that are mandatory for law enforcement. There is also more money coming from the Opioid law suits. <p>Drug Task Force (DTF) 9:25AM</p>	<p><u>Beth Tischler, Dean Bliss and Charlie Horn – Drug Task Force.</u> Beth Tischler, Prosecutor, came in with Drug Task Force team for an update. Dean Bliss reviewed staffing and how they are set up. At this time they do not have a representative from Fremont PD or Bellevue PD. They do work with their Departments but no one is assigned at this time. They do have someone from Homeland Security working with them on a daily basis at no cost to the Drug Task Force. They reached out to get an analyst from the National Guard and they have sent an agent at no cost to the Drug Task Force. They applied for a grant from the Mental Health Board. They received \$90,000.00 to hire staff to work with individuals that have overdosed to get those individuals information on where they can get help. They feel confident this funding will be on going. Charlie Horn presented the 2022 Drug Task Force seizure report. He talked about the fact the drugs in the area change on a regular basis. Prosecutor Tischler would like to see DTF do more community outreach to inform the community on what is happening in the County. They are working hard to prosecute and get drugs off the streets. Commissioner Miller asked how they are educating younger individuals. Dean noted the DARE program is still being presented at sixth grade level and fourth grade level. The current program does try to talk more about what drugs are local they may see. 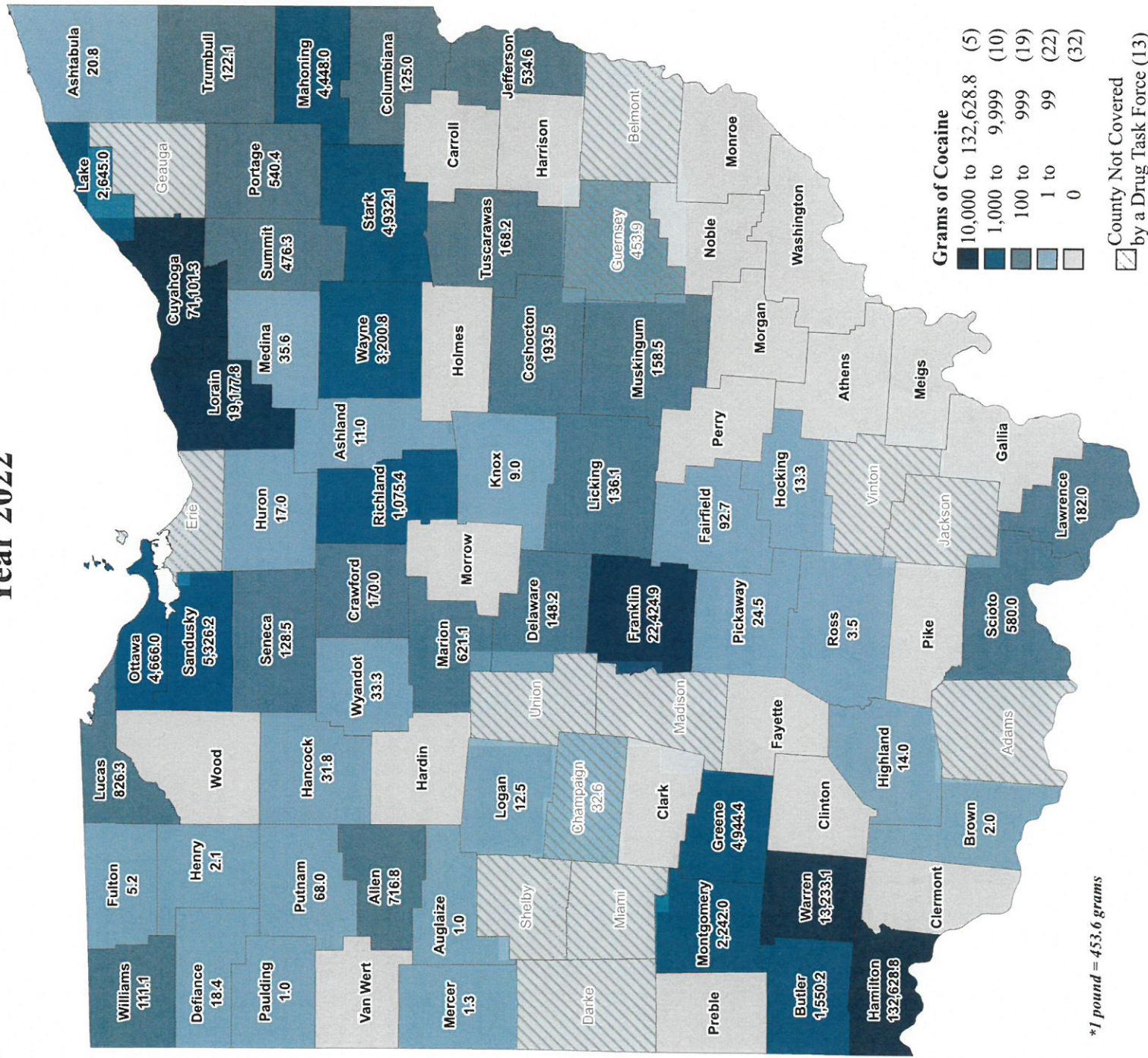

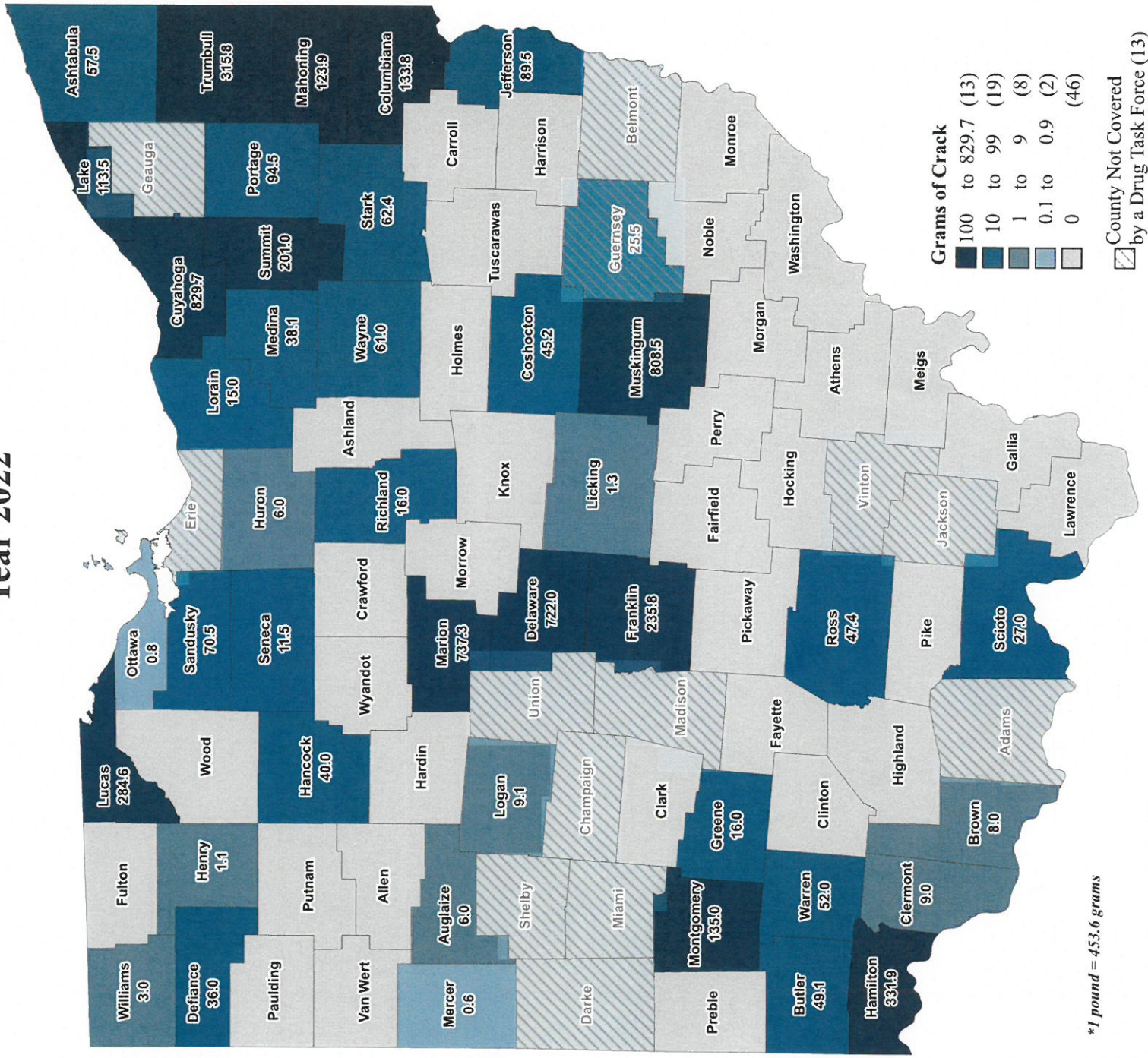

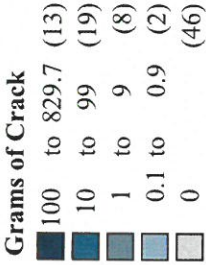

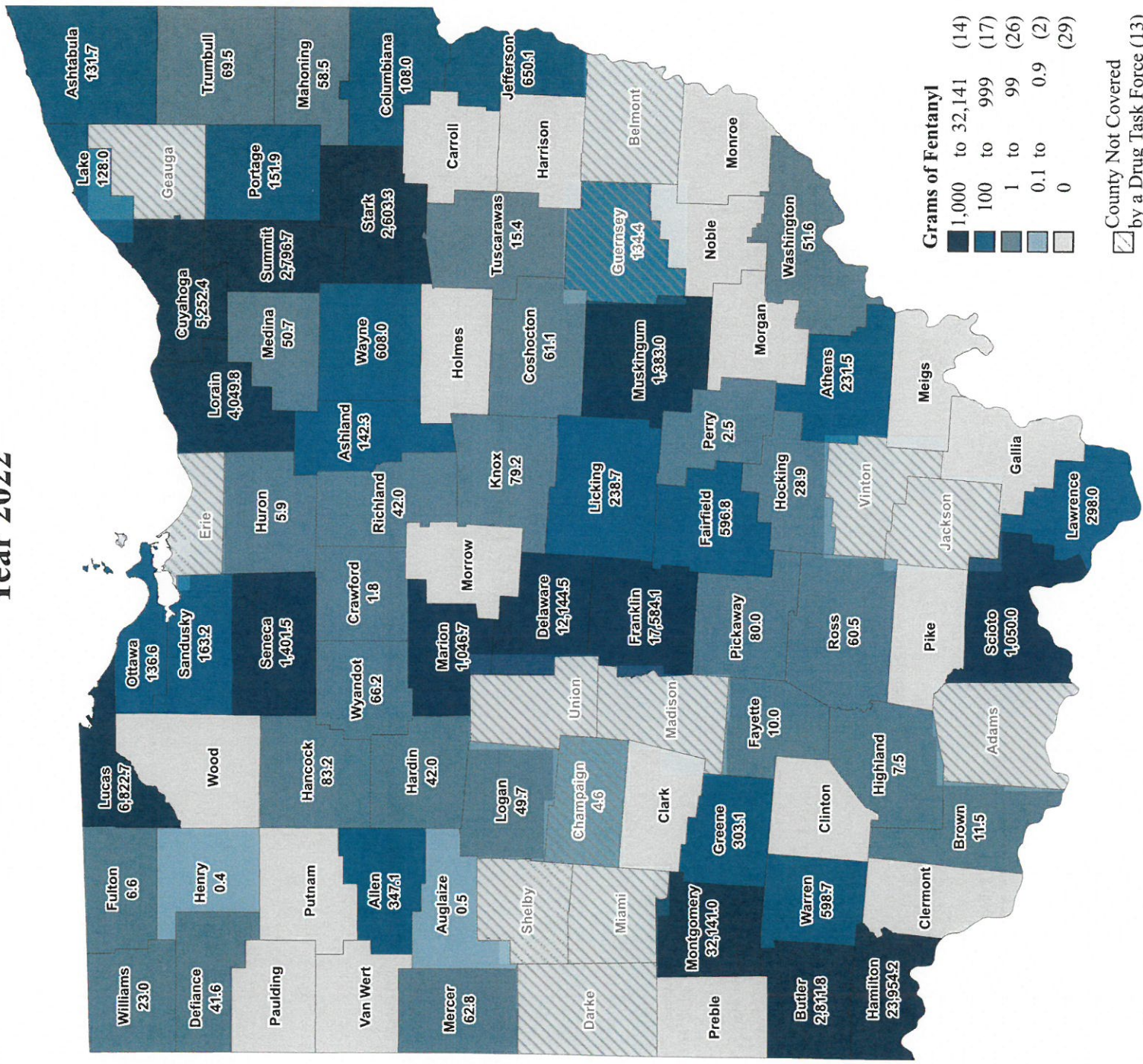


County Not Covered by a Drug Task Force (13)

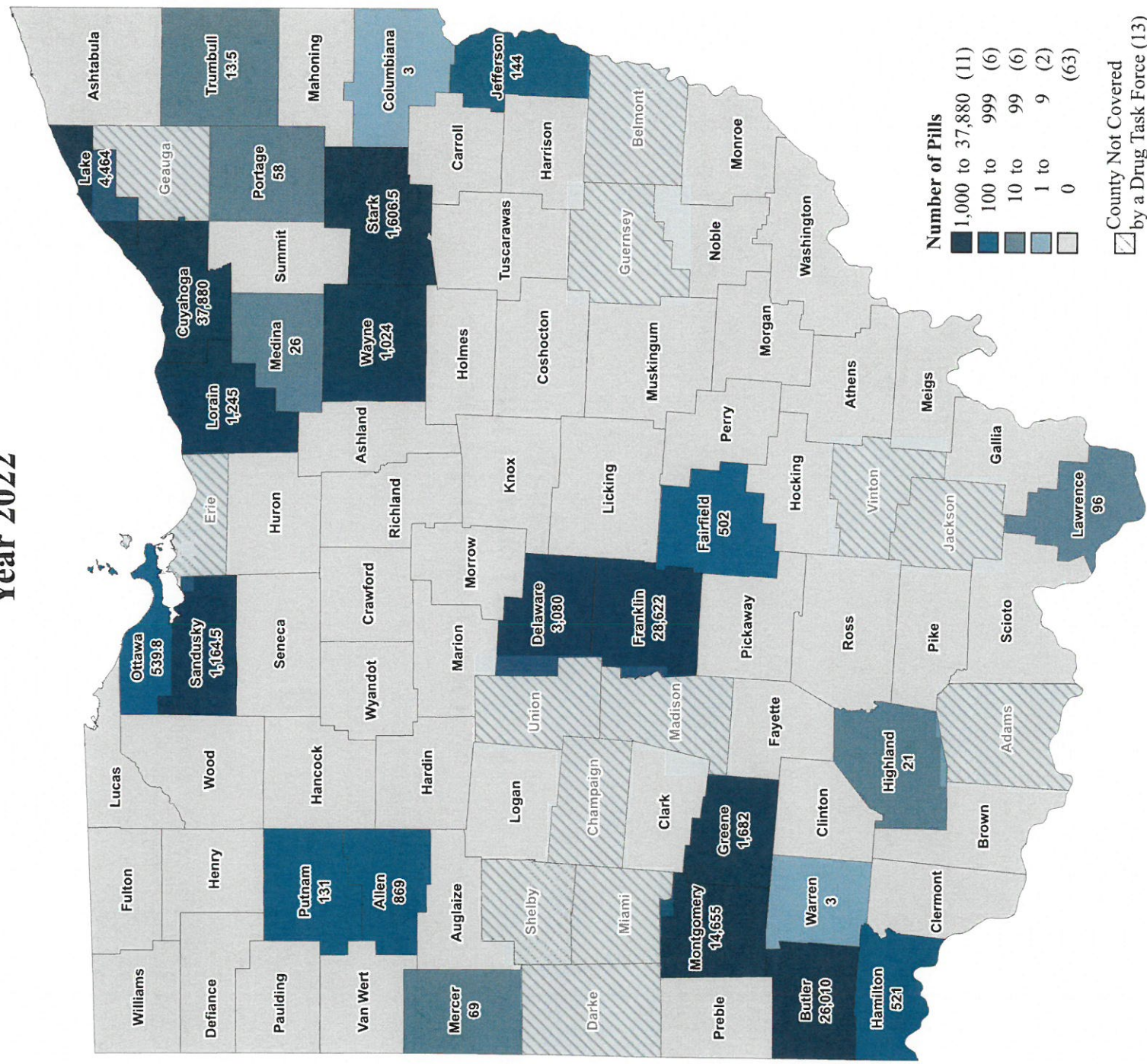

Ohio Drug Task Forces Seized Fentanyl Pills Year 2022

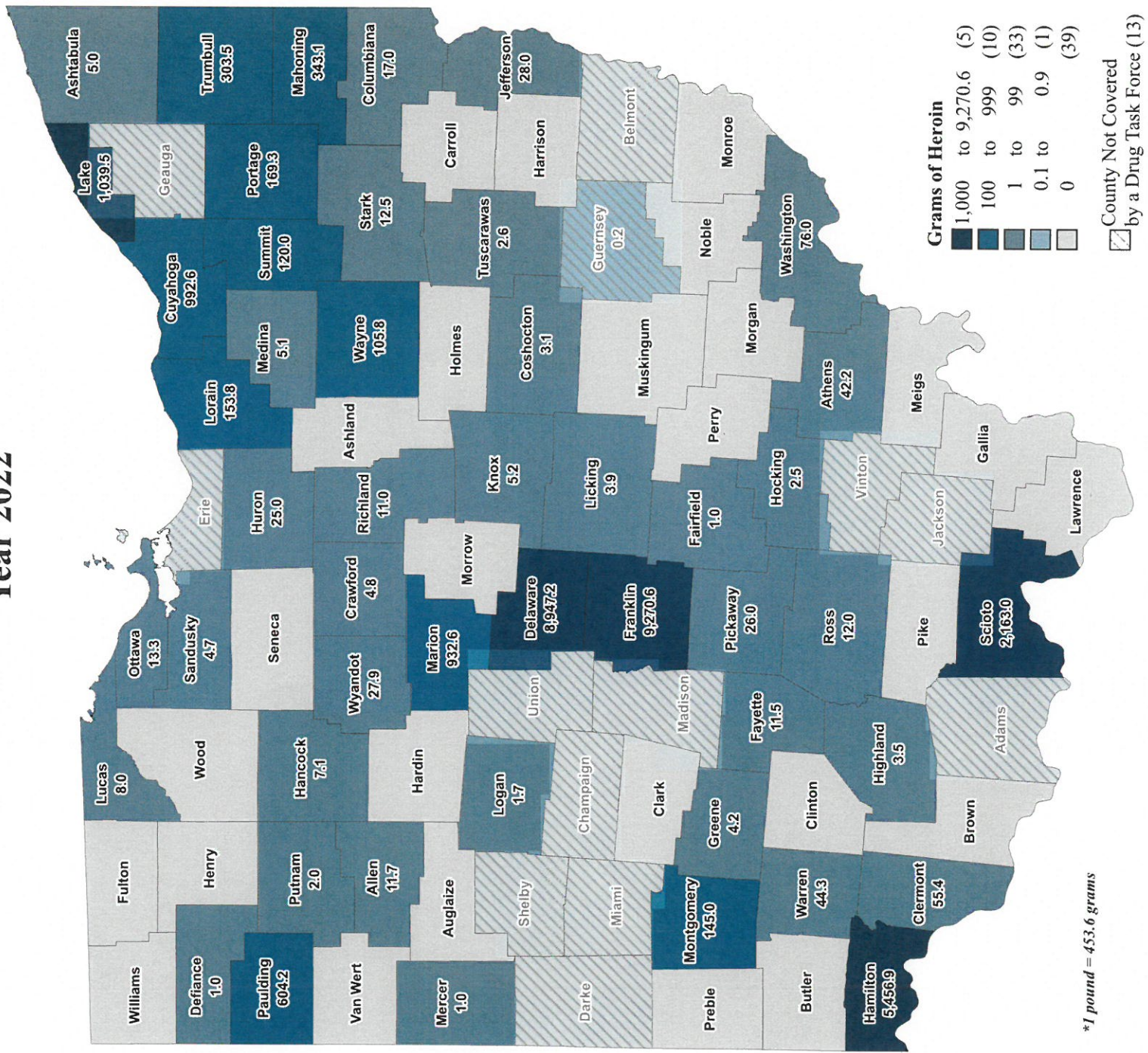

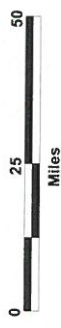


Ohio Drug Task Forces Seized Heroin Year 2022

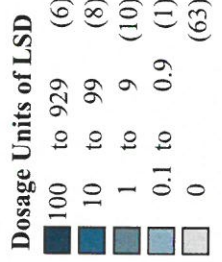
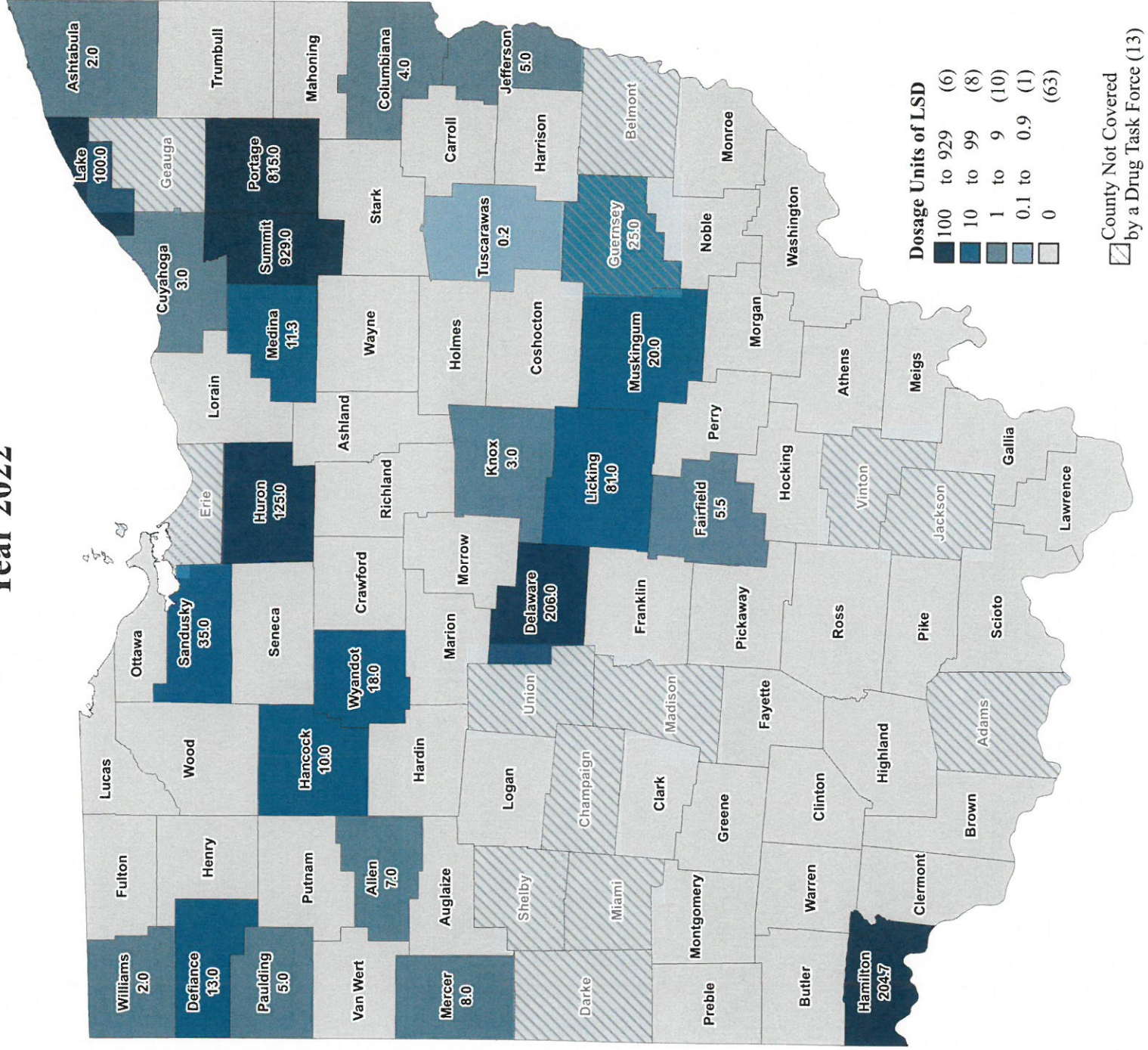

Ohio Drug Task Forces Seized LSD Year 2022

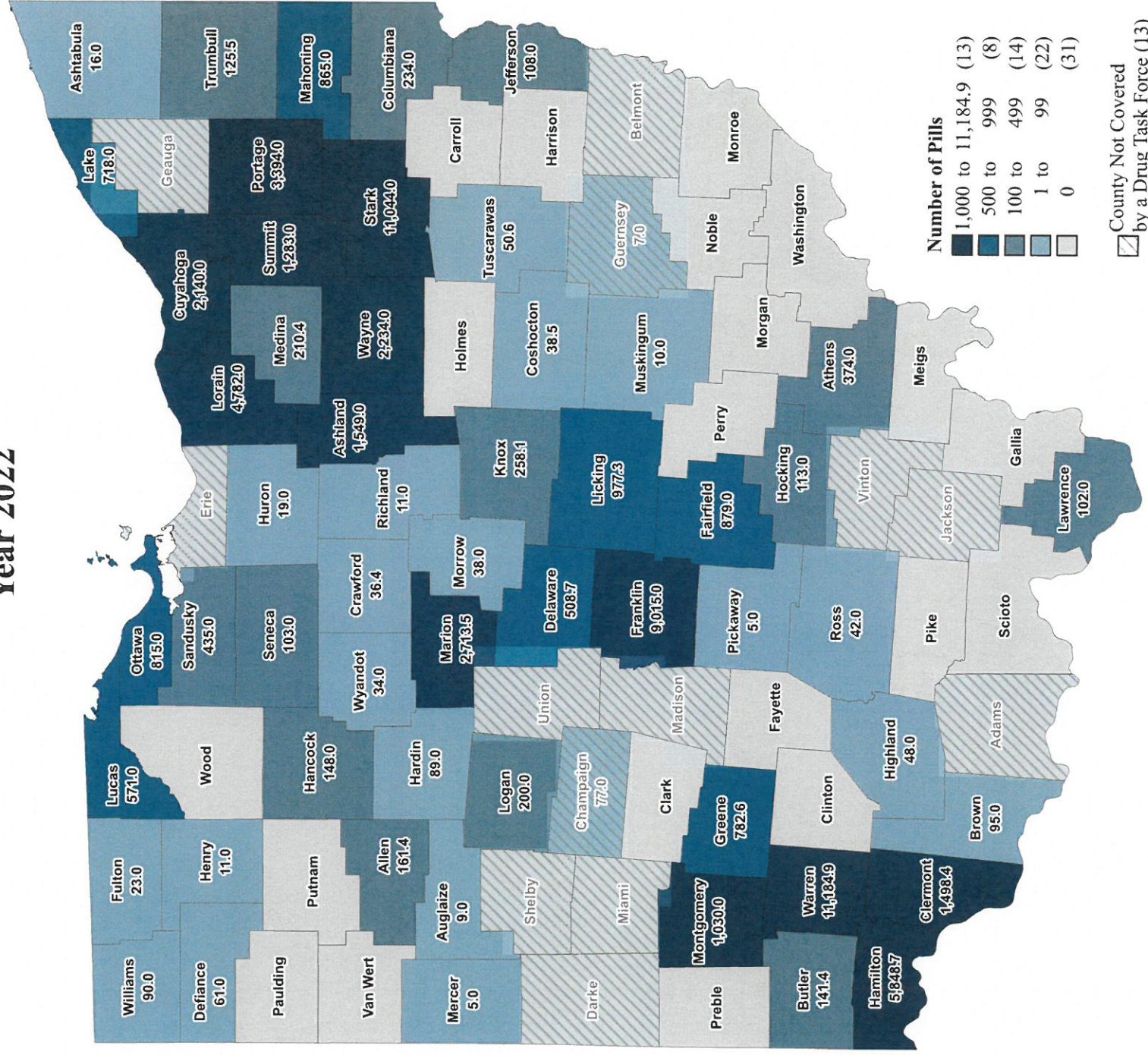

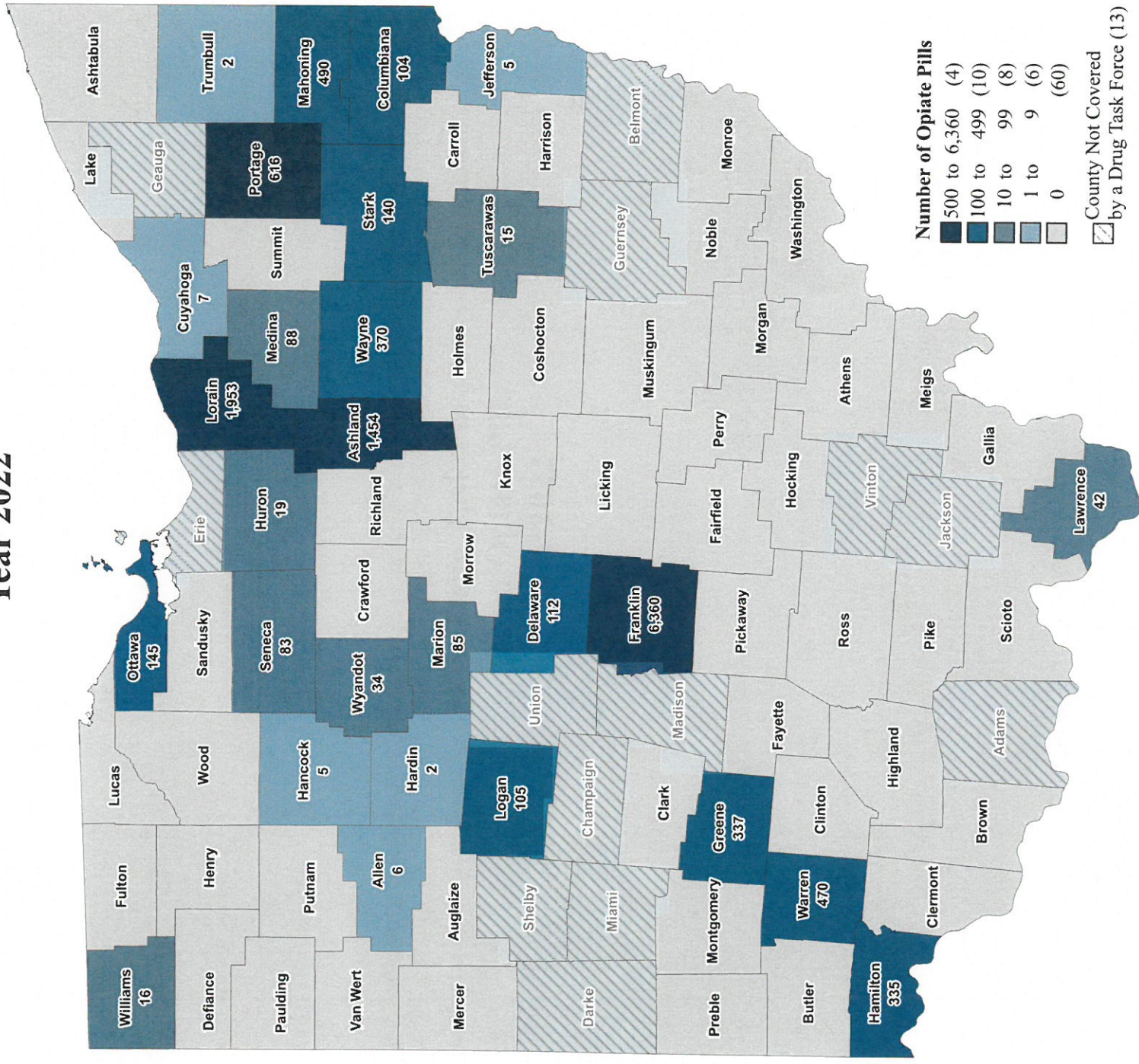

Ohio Drug Task Forces Seized Opiate Pills Year 2022

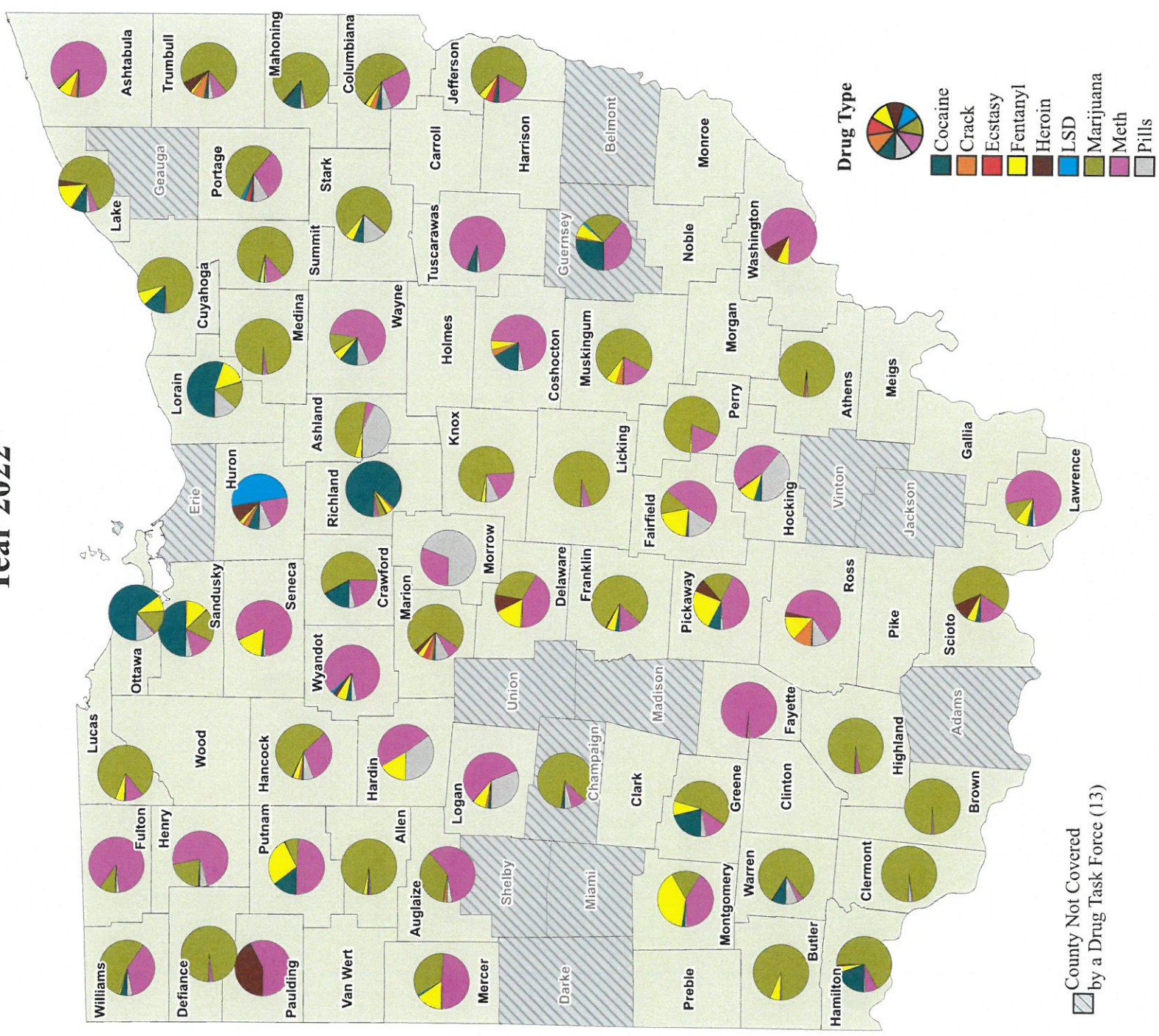

INTRODUCTION TO THE PROJECT MARC GLOTZBECKER – VILLAGE OF GIBSONBURG

PROJECT DESIGN OVERVIEW NEAL MATERNI KLEINFELDER

- Gravity Sanitary Sewer along Yeasting and south on Rodriguez Street.
- Sanitary Pump Station located at south end of Rodriguez on Village owned property.
- Force Main from pump station north on Rodriguez tying into ex. force main on Yeasting.
- Six (6) inch watermain on Rodriguez with new service lines and meter pits to residents.
- Individual Septic Tanks for residents ranging from 1,000 – 2,000-gallon capacity.
- Abandonment of Ex. Septic Tanks.
- Pavement repairs and other general restoration items as required.

PUBLIC OUTREACH NEAL MATERNI-MARC GLOTZBECKER

- Intent is to conduct a public meeting in March (Targeting the week of March 20, 2023)
- Provide update on project and explain to residents the sequencing of construction.
- Individual Septic Tank abandonment and installations.
- Disturbances to properties, expectations, restorations, etc.
- Need for easement for septic tanks for Village operation and maintenance purposes.




