They have 59 counties participating in electric aggregation programs with 3500 accounts. They have 11 counties in the natural gas aggregation. In the past year the aggregations have saved \$15.5 million for those in the program. There was a comment made about electric vehicles and where that energy will come from. The power you put in to a battery you never get coming back out of it for use. They are trying to get all the small pump stations together in 2025 to be put in aggregations to save money.
